

The Lions' Peace Poster Competition this year is for children born between November 16<sup>th</sup>, 1997 and November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2000 (aged 11,12 or 13 on November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011).

The theme this time is "Children Know Peace"

Artwork, in any media (though chalk, charcoal and pastel entries need to be sealed), should measure no less than 13 x 20 inches (33 x 50cm) and no more than 20 x 24 inches (50 x 60cm) and must be on a flexible material so they can be rolled for shipping, not being laminated, and not mat or framed finishing. The posters must not be folded.

Work must be the individual's own creation, not copied, and duplications will not be accepted.

3D and group work will not be accepted.

There should be no words, numbers or lettering on the front of the artwork. All artist signatures or initials should be written on the back of the poster.

On the reverse of the poster the student should write their name, address, date of birth, School and year, home phone number and a quote on the meaning of peace to them. The winner will need to get their parent or legal guardian to sign a form giving permission for the Lions' to use the poster for promotional and publicity purposes.

Posters are judged on originality, artistic merit and expression of the theme.

The Club winner's poster will go forward to a District final in the South West; progressing to a Multiple District final if they win that. The District winner is often invited to the Houses of Parliament and to the District Convention. After the MD final the winning poster is sent to a European level and then the winner of that goes to International level.

At present we are awaiting delivery of the Peace Poster packs, which will cost £8.00 each. Oakbrook have advised HQ that they are behind schedule with the printing.
