How can your club get involved?

Plant some trees in your area

Plant specimen trees to commemorate an event or person.

Join in with existing local schemes.

Find a plot of land to plant – local councils are a good place to start asking. Rough guide – an acre of land will take about 400 trees.

“Don't forget you do not have to do all the planting yourselves as it's a great way to involve Schools, Youth and other Community Groups”.

If the area to be planted has community access you may be eligible for a pack of free trees. Contact the *Woodland Trust* to find out – www.woodlandtrust.org.uk -more trees more good - funding and advice - **free tree packs**.

Sponsor others to plant

In this country try the National Forest, or the Woodland Trust will plant in your club's name for £2 per tree. In the developing world try contacting *Sponsor a Tree*.

All clubs taking part will be given a special banner patch and there are awards for the clubs which plant the most trees per member.

Please keep me informed about how many trees you have planted so that they can be included in the district total and I can then ensure you get your banner patch.
