Club Committee	Build results of CEQ, Workshop and Public Consultation into a set of goals and action plans for the club	Within two months after workshop
Club Committee	Carry out action plans to move towards goals	Ongoing
Club Mentor	Continues to assist and provide momentum where required	Ongoing
Zone Chairman and Facilitator	Holds follow-up meeting for all Club Delegates to monitor progress and share successes.	July/August 2012

### LAVICAM

(Laos - Vietnam - Cambodia)

Aid and Assistance for Laos, Vietnam & Cambodia with  
Family Support, Education & Medical

Lavicam was created in 2004 and has two Past District Governors on its Board of Directors as well as many Lions. Its aim was to support those in need within this poor area of Asia. Work in progress in these countries is as follows:-

#### LAOS

- Support 4 targeted schools helping those who are orphans, Hmong children, deaf and dumb and support for Teacher Training.
- Referrals of Children (21€ per month)
- Bank of Hope (Push a family to get by - materially not money)
- Help and Support (Family, Education & Health) amongst the Hmong villages in the mountains of Phou Khao Khouai

#### VIETNAM

- Following construction of school of Kontum support with funding of 5,500 € per year
- An embroidery workshop in Da Nang
- Press School Thuy Hoa (with Milk program against hyperthropsie)
- Referrals of Children (21€ per month)
- Construction of Wells
- Construction of Toilets in the village of Thuy Hoa
- School in Sadec for minorities

#### CAMBODIA

- 'Light Foyer of Mercy Home' in Phnom Phen (foster children with disability awareness education with music, dance and computer)
